

Phillip & Simon Shew To Boston Shew a Dued 80 acres land  
 This Indenture made this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of March 1829 between  
 Philip Shew and Simon Shew of the one part Boston  
 Shew of the other part & all of the State of North Carolina  
 and County of Wilkes, Witnesseth that for and in con-  
 sideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to them  
 in hand paid by the said Boston Shew (the receipt  
 whereof the said Philip Shew & Simon Shew doth acknowl-  
 edge and themselves paid and satisfied) hath bargained  
 sold, and conveyed a certain tract or parcel of land unto  
 the aforesaid Boston Shew his heirs & assigns forever  
 the same being in the County of Wilkes and lying on  
 the middle fork of Fishing Creek containing thirty  
 acres more or less. Beginning at the mouth of the  
 second branch and the North side of said Creek below  
 Phillip Shew's Mill, thence up the various courses of  
 said branch to Simon Shew's line, thence West with  
 said line to his corner on a white oak, thence  
 South to a hickory, the corner between Simon & Jacob  
 Shew, thence East to a white oak near the mill creek  
 thence South to a black oak a little above the Mill  
 corner of the Mill tract, thence East across the  
 Mill pond to a white oak on the side of the hill thence  
 North to a white oak sapling a little below the mill  
 in Simon Shew's line, thence with a marked line to  
 a white oak sapling on the top of the hill on an  
 Eastward direction, thence Northward along a marked  
 line to the beginning at the aforesaid branch including  
 Phillip Shew's Mill. Together with every right & privilege  
 to the said land belonging and they the said Philip  
 Shew and Simon Shew doth bind themselves their  
 heirs & assigns to warrant and forever defend the  
 title of the aforesaid land to him the said Boston  
 Shew his heirs & assigns free from the claim or claims  
 of any person or persons whatever. In witness  
 whereof they the aforesaid Philip Shew & Simon Shew  
 have set their hands and seals the day and date  
 above written.

James Ferguson To Sarah Tilley Bill of Sale

State of North Carolina, Wilkes County,  
 Know all men by these presents that James Ferguson  
 for services done by my daughter Sarah Tilley in waiting  
 and attending on me in my old age I do therefore convey  
 and make unto her the said Sarah Tilley my right &  
 title to a negro boy slave named Enna about twelve years  
 old to have and to hold free and clear of any claim  
 whatever and for the love and affection that I have for  
 the said Sarah Tilley I do therefore make and convey  
 all my right and title to a negro woman slave about  
 38 years old named Cordia as an assistant to her  
 in waiting and attending on me while I live to have  
 and to hold after my death free and clear of any  
 claim or claims forever. In witness whereof I have  
 set my hand and seal this 11<sup>th</sup> of March 1836.
